

## About The Show

Andrew Lloyd Webber's award-winning masterpiece, Sunset Boulevard, based on Billy Wilder's legendary film, comes to The Grove Theatre, Dunstable in a stunning Dunstable Musical Theatre Company production.

Sunset Boulevard weaves a magnificent tale of faded glory and unfulfilled ambition. Silent movie star Norma Desmond longs for a return to the big screen, having been discarded by tinsel town with the advent of "talkies." Her glamour has faded in all but her mind. Ageing and largely forgotten for years she lives in her dilapidated mansion in Hollywood with her butler and chauffeur, Max. Impoverished screenwriter Joe Gillis, on the run from debt collectors, stumbles into her reclusive world. Persuaded to work on her 'masterpiece', a film script that she believes will put her back in front of the cameras, he is seduced by her and her luxurious lifestyle. Joe becomes entrapped in a claustrophobic world until his love for another woman leads him to break free with dramatic consequences.

Sunset Boulevard had its world premiere at London's Adelphi Theatre on July 12th, 1993. The show has been staged across the world with productions in Canada, the Netherlands, Australia, and tours in the US and UK.

# Director - Alan Goss



Alan has been involved with Dunstable Musical Theatre Company for more years than he can remember! He is proud to have been asked to direct this production of Sunset Boulevard and he cannot think of a better show to direct for his swansong!

Alan has also directed many productions for DMTC both at The Queensway Hall and The Grove Theatre, namely:

The King and I (twice), 42nd Street, Crazy for you, Fiddler on the Roof, Jesus Christ Superstar and A Slice of Saturday to name but a few!

He has not only enjoyed directing but has also trodden the boards taking part in many musicals over the years such as: West Side Story, Half A Sixpence, The Pyjama game, Oklahoma, Carmen and Sister Act among others. Alan has also been a member of Dunstable Rep Theatre Club since the mid-60s, and has directed and performed in more shows than he can remember! He has also directed for numerous other local societies over the years.

Sunset Boulevard has always been a production that Alan wanted to direct ever since he saw it in the early 90s. It has been a real honour to have worked with such a talented cast, creative team and technical crew on what will be his last production!

# Musical Director - Joanna Smale

Jo has been a member of DMTC since she was 14 years old. She has performed on stage singing and dancing but these days you will mainly find her in the orchestra pit.

She considers herself very lucky to have her talented husband, Ed Smale, by her side as rehearsal pianist and member of our orchestra.



Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical masterpiece is a challenging score that mixes the lush lyrical sounds of the strings with the playful jazz ensemble. Cleverly and seamlessly blending the two worlds within the script together. DMTC has invested in an orchestra for our production of Sunset Boulevard, covering 18 parts. Jo hopes you will agree that it was well worth it!

# Choreographer - Jo Herd

Jo studied many forms of dance and musical theatre right through to a college diploma. She has also performed for professional jobs in London as a dancer in the early days of her career.

She says that it has been a joy being asked back to choregraph for DMTC again. She enjoys challenging herself and bringing her visions to stage. This show has been quite



a test for Jo in many way as it encompasses multiple styles of dance and movement. After being involved with and choregraphing for a handful of local theatre societies, working with DMTC again and performing at The Grove is always rather special.

## From Our Director

My first introduction to Andrew Lloyd Webber's Sunset Boulevard was in 1994 during an outing with the then DAOS, now DMTC. The production starred Betty Buckley as Norma Desmond and a very young John Barrowman as Joe Gillis.

I remember being enthralled by the music and set design, which conjured Hollywood sound stages, car chases and Norma's mansion in the flash of a lighting cue. I fell in love with the show then and it has remained one of my all time favourite musicals. Sitting in the theatre that day I could never have imagined I would one day have the honour of directing the piece.

This has been a very challenging production which has pulled together the very best of our local acting, technical and production talent and it is a real pleasure to be performing at Dunstable's Grove Theatre once again.

Sunset Boulevard is a large-scale production, with a constantly moving set, hundreds of lighting cues, projections, complex sound cues and some very quick costumes changes, In all, apart from the cast there are approximately 30 people supporting this show behind the scenes! plus a wonderful 18 piece orchestra and this production has taken at least 6 months of extensive planning. My final thanks must go to Jo Smale, our MD and Jo Herd, our Choreographer!

#### Norma Desmond - Julia Fraser



Julia is excited to be involved with her first Dunstable Musical Theatre Company show, and what an honour it is for her to play such a prestigious and iconic role. Over the years Julia has performed in many musicals and operas, roles including both The Baker's Wife and the Witch in *Into the Woods*, Mary Magdalene in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, Nancy in *Oliver* and many years ago she thoroughly enjoyed playing the role of Carmen.

Since then, directing and musical directing shows has also been a large part of Julia's life, directing many operas for Bedfordshire Youth Opera, *Whistle Down the Wind* and *Little Shop of Horrors* for The Griffin Players, and in 2022 Musical

Directing *Once* for ACT at The Little Theatre in Dunstable. She is thrilled to be reunited on stage with both Elliot Bunker and Alan Clarke, who played Jesus and Pontius Pilate alongside her Mary Magdalene 25 years ago, and she is also really pleased to be in the same show as her close friend and singing partner Rachel Maloy, as they sing regularly in the local A Capella vocal group Peculi8, but have only ever trodden the boards together once.

# Max von Mayerling - Alan Clarke



Alan has had a passion for theatre since the age of nine when he first took to the stage. Since then, he has either been in or directed over one hundred local productions, including the lead role of Tevye in *Fiddler on the Roof*, Pontius Pilate in *Jesus Christ Superstar* and Simon Stride in *Jekyll & Hyde* for DMTC. Alan also runs his own local group ACT Company with his wife Megan, which celebrated twenty-five years in 2022 with the UK amateur premiere of the smash-hit musical *Once* as its twenty-fifth production.

Alan also enjoyed five years as a professional actor, working on touring productions of the contemporary hit *Art* and an adaptation of *Rebecca*, with Simon Shepherd and Nigel Havers respectively, but also fulfilling his ambition of appearing in a West End production in the spoof musical *Ducktastic!*, directed by his theatrical idol, Sir Kenneth Branagh. He is delighted to be taking the role of Max in *Sunset Boulevard* for DMTC as it's one of his favourite musicals.

### Joe Gillis - Elliott Bunker

Some years back Elliott was a regular on local stage, but since moving to Hitchin has spent most of his time at The Queen Mother Theatre, where is acts, directs and is currently the Chairman of The Bancroft Players. With Hitchin he has directed *Cabaret, The Rise & Fall of Little Voice, The Lady In The Van, Quartet, Shirley Valentine* and *Bette & Joan*. He has appeared in several shows including *Avenue Q, Grease, The Lady Killers, Hamlet,* and last year played Kenneth Williams in *Cleo, Camping, Emmanuelle & Dick*. Most recently he directed Stephen Sondheim's *Company*.



It was while directing this last musical that he got a serious bout

of FOMO and heard about the auditions for *Sunset Boulevard*. He has performed twice with what was Dunstable Amateur Operatic Society over 25 years ago, first in *Chess* as Frederick Trumper and lastly as Bill Snibson in *Me & My Girl*, in the last production at the old Queensway Hall. He was also a regular at the Dunstable Rep, playing the Emcee in *Cabaret* and in many Alistair Brown productions, including *Tartuffe, Jekyll & Hyde, A Midsummer's Night Dream* and *The Anastasia Files*. Elliott has very much enjoyed his time back at DMTC; reconnecting with old theatre friends, making a few new ones and being directed by Alan Goss for the first time despite knowing him for several decades. He is really excited about performing at The Grove Theatre, which he has never done before, and with an amazing 19-piece orchestra.



Having grown up in Dunstable, Rachel is thrilled to finally tick performing at The Grove Theatre off her bucket list! Rachel is an advocate for mental health, and is on a mission to help people find their singing voice and in the process improve their wellbeing. The myth that individuals cannot sing needs to be busted (and bustin' makes her feel good!) She currently leads both the Glee Club and Singing Mamas Choirs in Leighton Buzzard, is an accredited Vocal Balance Singing Teacher and a qualified Vocal Health and Mental Health First Aider. She is



a wedding ceremony singer, and has performed with local a cappella vocal group, Peculi8, since its inception in 2005.

Rachel is delighted to be returning to the stage with DMTC, having previously performed in recent productions of *Little Shop of Horrors, Nunsense*, and not-so-recent productions of *The Sound of Music* and *42nd Street!* She is incredibly excited to have been given the opportunity to play Betty Schaefer alongside such huge local talent, which includes one of her best friends (even though they have no actual on-stage interaction!)

When Rachel is not singing, conducting, teaching or performing, she is wife and best friend to Toby, Mummy to Ted and Heidi, and can usually be found eating copious amounts of Cadbury's Marvellous Creations.



DMTC is very proud of its long association with the National Operatic & Dramatic Association (NODA), founded in 1899 it is the leading representative body for amateur theatre in the UK. TheAssociation has a membership of approximately 2400 amateur theatre groups and over 2000 individual members staging musicals, operas, plays,

concerts and pantomimes in a wide variety of venues ranging from the country's leading professional theatres to village halls. Covering a broad spectrum of age ranges NODA member societies meet the needs of all levels of both performers, whether dramatic, dance or musical, and those involved backstage, front of house or in society administration.

#### NODA aims:

- To give a shared voice to amateur theatre
- To help societies and individuals achieve the highest standards of best practice and performance
- To provide leadership and advice to enable amateur theatre to tackle the challenges and opportunities of the 21st century.

To achieve these aims NODA is divided into eleven regions, each headed by a regional councillor who sits on the national council (ruling body of the Association), and supported by a network of regional representatives and officials. These volunteers are the vital link to the grass roots of the Association; the amateur theatre groups themselves and their members.

To provide support and assistance to these volunteers the Association is administered from its office in Peterborough by a knowledgeable and friendly staff who can deal with any enquiry about amateur theatre. Membership of NODA provides theatre groups and individuals with a wide range of benefits including access to NODA's advice service at national and regional level, as well as representation to government, access to funding agencies, direct access to rights holders and the media as well access to regional and national conferences, workshops and seminars to help share information on best practice.

NODA holds an annual residential Summer School (with bursaries available) offering training from professional tutors in a wide range of both performance and technical courses as well as a similar residential academy to provide similar performance based training for those under 18.

NODA also holds an annual national and regional programme and poster competition to encourage high standards in design. Through its trading arm, NODA Limited members have access to a varied range of products and services including insurance for both societies and individuals, long service awards that recognise the dedication made by individuals to amateur theatre, discounts on plays, vocal scores, libretti and technical books and a range of NODA branded merchandise. As a rights holder NODA Limited has 150 pantomimes by leading authors as well as a growing catalogue of plays and musicals.
